





BRUCE SPRINGSTEEN ARCHIVES & CENTER FOR AMERICAN MUSIC

A new 30,000-square-foot building will house the Archives, the Center for American Music, related exhibition galleries, and a 230-seat, state-of-the-art theater. Designed by the acclaimed New Yorkbased architectural firm CookFox, the building will be located on Monmouth's campus, not far from where Springsteen wrote his landmark song, "Born to Run," some 50 years ago.


